Parents are encouraged to book a meeting time with their child's teachers to discuss their progress.


### SCHOOL PHOTOS

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**ANGLICAN IDENTITY** *With Ms Shea Doyle*

Every year, Christians around the world, use the month of September to celebrate God's beautiful earth, and renew their shared commitment to preserving and restoring that beauty. This time of the year is called the Season of Creation. This year, the theme for the season is "A home for all? Renewing the Oikos of God". Oikos is the Greek word for "home," or "household". The earth is a home for all, an environment built to support and sustain us so we can live and flourish together.

The Season of Creation reminds us of our role as stewards of the environment and encourages all people to reflect on the ways we can nurture and restore our home. Aboriginal Christian Leader and Common Grace CEO Brooke Prentis from the Wakka Wakka peoples reminds us "loving our neighbour means loving our people neighbour, our tree neighbour, plant neighbour, animal neighbour, bird neighbour, fish neighbour, land neighbour, water neighbour, sky neighbour." At the heart of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people's culture is their understanding of these interdependent relationships and the need to care for country. This is echoed in the following Bible passage from Job 12;

"But ask the animals, and they will teach you,  
or the birds in the sky, and they will tell you;  
or speak to the earth, and it will teach you,  
or let the fish in the sea inform you."

During this Season of Creation, I would like to encourage all members of the Cobram AGS community to consider the ways they could contribute to the restoration of our home. We can take some inspiration from our Year 7 cohort who recently participated in a brainstorm of ideas relating to things they could do to look after the environment. Here are some of their suggestions.

- Unplug charges and things when not needed
- Plant a tree
- Make a herb garden
- Recycle
- Walk more often or ride a bike
- Don't throw plastic in the ocean
- Turn of lights when not using them
- Buy things with less plastic packaging
- Shop locally/ organically





**Foundation R** Mylah, Spencer and Charlotte were awarded the Shining Star Awards for their remarkable efforts during Remote Teaching & Learning.


Billy and Esther were awarded the Shining Star Awards for their excellent persistence during Remote Teaching & Learning.



Congratulations to each of you, keep up your reading every night and Mrs Swoffer is looking forward to seeing you again soon to choose another picture story book to take home.






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## 3/4K FOOD ART

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## GROWING WITH GROK!

Students in Year Three and Four at Cobram AGS recently participated in the NCSS Challenge computer programming competition. Head of Junior School Mrs Mary Swoffer teaches Grok to this cohort throughout the school year and twice a year their skills are tested in a National competition. The challenge supports the skills the students learn in the classroom and then extends their thinking further in a challenge environment where they apply their learning to create a program.

### Why do we teach our students to Code at CAGS?


Programming (also known as coding) is how sites like Facebook and apps like Instagram are made. Knowing how to program is like having a computing super power. It's a skill that not only teaches our students how to work with computers, but also teaches them how to think about solving problems with systems.

The NCSS Challenge for our Year Three / Four students explored blockly coding. Mrs Melonie Smith, Head of Mathematics at Cobram AGS has then captured this interest and used the students own designs to create models using the schools 3D printers.

Our Upper Primary students are then introduced to coding in Python 3.6, which is extended into the secondary school area. Python coding is a scripting language used for many different purposes such as web applications and scientific research. Companies like Google, Facebook and Reddit all use Python in their infrastructure and web services.

This year our Year three four students excelled in NCSS Challenge with a staggering 70% of students in Year Three achieving a Distinction or higher and in Year Four 80% of the student body received a Distinction or higher. Well done to all of this cohort, keep up the great work!



•The Year 7, Intermediate and Senior Girls Badminton teams. As you are probably aware, the Year 7 Girls won the Hume Region final and were headed to the State championships but unfortunately these have been curtailed by the coronavirus lockdowns. The Intermediate and Senior Girls teams' involvement in the Regional finals were postponed once before the current lockdown destroyed their opportunity of participation in these. Both sides were in healthy states to give this a fantastic effort so what might have been???

•A number of our students are still pinning their hopes on involvement in SSV Golf trials. Kohen Haddrell (Year 4) has impressed at club level where he has been plying his craft at Senior Adult representative tournaments. 


Our final year students are on the home stretch and they face an intense couple of months full of exam revision and completion. Unfortunately there will be no holidays for this cohort of students as our teaching staff have filled the two weeks with exam preparation and practice exams in order to give them the best opportunity for success when they sit their actual exams beginning with English on the 27th of October. Prior to the English exam all Unit 3 & 4 students are required to sit the GAT on Tuesday the 5th of October (the first day of Term 4). Students are required to wear their school uniform and return to the campus on this day. Health and wellbeing is a very important aspect of successful exam preparation and I implore families to ensure that every student has a strict routine over the term break that includes adequate, exercise, recreation, SLEEP and of course study. Routine will be the key to effectively using this time, getting up at the same time everyday is crucial.

Our VCE subject selection has been finalised and our elective programs for years 7 & 8 as well as 9 & 10 will be put to the students in the first weeks of Term 4. We are excited to finalise these classes and can already see a positive link between our pathway's program and VCE subject selection after only 12 months. ## SENIOR SCHOOL NEWS *Continued...*

### GROK - PERFECT SCORES

Following on from the Growing with Grok article earlier in this edition of The Crier, in the secondary school setting the Grok learning platform is incorporated into the mathematics curriculum. Students start to stretch their competencies out as their interest grows. Some students continue with the Blockly platform while others step up to Python language, and we try to cater for a range of abilities.


In 2021 we had Three students enrol in the study of Computer Science at VCE, one in "Data Analytics", two in "Software Development" and one of those also studied the university level "Algorithmics" course. At Year Eleven, students create their own web pages to communicate science practical results. They all use these new found skills programming their TIInspire Graphing calculators with confidence. Some even find that "the process of breaking down a formula in order to write the programs means that their overall mathematical understanding improves" says Cobram AGS Head of Mathematics, Mrs Melonie Smith.

It is the growth of this subject in the school that has led to these subject choices being possible. In the National Computer Science Course offered in the secondary school, we had many students participate with some noteworthy results. In the Python Language Beginners course we had two High Distinctions, one Distinction and three credits awarded in year nine alone. In the Intermediate course we had two perfect scores awarded and for the first time since starting the computer science program and watching it grow, this year we had one student obtain a perfect score in the advanced level. Even if students do not go on to compete in these competition or even if they do not want to pursue a career in computer science, the skills they develop by participating each year and striving for personal improvement are priceless.

Students are still able to complete the competition questions at home now and, while they will not be scored, they can have a go at reading and completing as many as they can, seeking help from teachers, in order to better their understanding next year.

### YEAR 12 SURPRISE!




